Prayer of the Day

The Proclamation of the Word of God (please be seated)

First Reading: Romans 6:12-23

A reading from Paul's letter to the church in Rome.

Do not let sin exercise dominion in your mortal bodies, to make you obey their passions. No longer present your members to sin as instruments of wickedness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and present your members to God as instruments of righteousness. For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace. What then? Should we sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? But thanks be to God that you, having once been slaves of sin, have become obedient from the heart to the form of teaching to which you were entrusted, and that you, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness. I am speaking in human terms because of your natural limitations. For just as you once presented your members as slaves to impurity and to greater and greater iniquity, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness for sanctification. When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. So what advantage did you then get from the things of which you now are ashamed? The end of those things is death. But now that you have been freed from sin and enslaved to God, the advantage you get is sanctification. The end is eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Reader: The Word of the Lord. **People: Thanks be to God.**

The Apostle's Creed (Please stand)

Let us confess the faith of our baptism, as we say, Presider:

All:

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Confession

Presider: Sisters and brothers, we can trust God at all times, for the Holy One is our refuge and

our salvation. So with confidence, let us pour out a shared confession of our hearts.

All: We confess to you, steadfast God,

> that we wander from the path of love upon which we are meant to walk. Fears divide us, prejudice hardens us,

violence destroys us.

One: But God eternally beckons.

All: We turn our hearts again to you, God of grace and mercy.

Forgive us of love that is self-satisfied,

and teach us love that is self- and other-affirming. Forgive us of faith that makes us rush to judgment,

and give us faith that fills us with compassion.

Forgive us of peace we have made with our divisions,

and unite us in peace that passes understanding.

We pray, with thanksgiving, in the name of Christ. Amen.

One: By God's mercy, our feet are set again upon the path of faithfulness;

our hearts are set again upon the coming of God's realm.

All: Thanks be to God, our hope and our guide forever.

and elsewhere who have been murdered and tortured because of who they are. We

remember them and the people who love them. LGBTQ+ refugees from around the world

seeking safety and sanctuary. We remember them and the people who welcome them. Trans and gender-diverse people in Canada, the United States, Brazil, and elsewhere, who are targeted victims of hate crimes and assaults. We remember them and the people who love them. LGBTQ+ people whose dignity and self-esteem have been eroded by hateful systems and structures. We remember them and seek to be people who love more fully.

Individually, we each uniquely reflect your glory and express your love, but anti-gay violence, homophobia, and transphobia have blocked many from recognizing your beauty in all people. All of creation suffers from the effects of such hate, fear, and violence.

Daily, may we dedicate ourselves to building bridges of love and hope where harmful divisions have been made, making equity and equality for all people our goal, while working continually for justice, so that

Everyone can live fully in your love. Amen. (a prayer by Alydia Smith for Pride month)

Leader: In peace let us pray to the Lord, saying, "Lord, have mercy."

For peace from on high and for our salvation, let us pray to the Lord.

People: Lord, have mercy.

Leader: For the peace of the whole world, for the welfare of the holy Church of God, and for the

unity of all, for our bishops, and for all the clergy and people, let us pray to the Lord.

People: Lord, have mercy.

Leader: For Elizabeth our Queen, for the leaders of the nations, and for all in authority, for this city,

and for every city and community, let us pray to the Lord.

People: Lord, have mercy.

Leader: For good weather, and for abundant harvests for all to share, that the hungry may be

fed, the homeless housed, and all may be cared for, let us pray to the Lord.

People: Lord, have mercy.

Leader: For the sick and the suffering (especially . . .), for prisoners and captives, and for their

safety, health, and salvation, let us pray to the Lord.
