After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, saying, 'Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!' And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God, singing, 'Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and might be to our God for ever and ever! Amen.' Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, 'Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?' I said to him, 'Sir, you are the one that knows.' Then he said to me, 'These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them. Eucharistic Prayer



The Presiding Celebrant will begin the Eucharistic Prayer by either singing or saying the preface to the prayer. The preface will conclude with the words "to proclaim the glory of your name." We then sing verses 1-3 of the Sanctus as follows:



The Presiding Celebrant continues the Eucharistic Prayer. After the words over the cup and the elevation of the chalice, we sing verse 4 of the Sanctus:

People: (verse 4) Glory be to you, O Lord! Glory now and evermore! Hosanna in the highest!

> The Presiding Celebrant concludes the Eucharistic Prayer, and at the elevation of the bread and cup, we sing verse 5 of the Sanctus:

People: (verse 5) Glory be to you, O Lord! Glory now and evermore! To you for evermore. Amen.

Choir: As we proclaim your death, as we recall your life, We remember your promise to return again. The bread we break and share was scattered once as grain: Just as now it is gathered, making your people one.

Choir: We eat this living bread, we drink this saving cup: Sign of hope in our broken world, source of lasting love. Hold us in unity, in love for all to see; That the world may believe in you, God of all who love.
