THE GATHERING OF THE COMMUNITY

We gather with song and prayer as the People of God

Hymn: #599 Awake! Awake! Fling Off the Night (*Tune: Duke Street*) Awake! Awake! Fling off the night, for God has sent a glorious light, And we who live in Christ's new day must works of darkness put away.

PLEASE STAND

Awake and sing, with praises strong, in psalm and hymn and spirit-song. Let love our words and works renew with all that's good and right and true.

Let in the light; all sin expose to Christ, whose life no darkness knows. Before the cross expectant kneel, that Christ may judge, and judging, heal.

Then rise as children of the light. Be neither proud, nor hide from sight. Be careful how you live, and wise to sift the truth from cunning lies.

Through Christ give thanks to God, and say to other sleepers on the way: "Awake, and rise up from the dead that Christ may shine on you instead!"

We read and respond to God's message in scripture

First Reading: Malachi 3:1-4

PLEASE BE SEATED

A Reading from the Book of Malachi.

See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years.

Reader: The Word of the Lord. People: **Thanks be to God.**

Psalm 84:1-7 (Tune: Eventide)

PLEASE REMAIN SEATED

How lovely is your dwelling place, O Lord! My soul longs to be present in your courts. With joy I sing to you with heart and flesh, To you, O living God of power and might.

Even the sparrow finds a place to nest And swallows find a place to lay their young Near to your altars, Lord, my King and God. Blest they who dwell in your house, singing praise.

Blesséd are they whose strength is found in you, Your pilgrim people trav'ling to your house. They make the wasteland burst with springs and rain. They grow in strength as they see God in Zion.

Second Reading: Hebrews 2:14-18

A Reading from the Letter to the Hebrew Church.

Since, therefore, the children share flesh and blood, he himself likewise shared the same things, so that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by the fear of death. For it is clear that he did not come to help angels, but the descendants of Abraham. Therefore he had to become like his brothers and sisters in every respect, so that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make a sacrifice of atonement for the sins of the people. Because he himself was tested by what he suffered, he is able to help those who are being tested.

Reader: The Word of the Lord. People: **Thanks be to God.**

The Holy Gospel: Luke 2:22-40

Reader: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Reader: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

People: Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord (as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord"), and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons." Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying, "Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel." And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, "This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed - and a sword will pierce your own soul too." There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshipped there with fasting and prayer night and day. At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem. When they had finished everything required by the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favour of God was upon him.

Reader: The Gospel of Christ.

People: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

He blessed the disciples with His Holy Spirit and sent them forth, east and west, north and south. We commit ourselves to Jesus, to one another as brothers and sisters and to His mission in the world. In the grace of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Presider: Having reaffirmed our faith, let us prepare to offer our prayers to God.

Offertory Hymn: CP#381 Praise, My Soul

Praise, my soul, the King of heaven; to his feet your tribute bring; Ransomed, healed, restored, forgiven, evermore his praises sing. Alleluia, alleluia, praise the everlasting King.

Praise him for his grace and favour to our forebears in distress; Praise him, still the same forever, slow to chide and swift to bless; Alleluia, alleluia, glorious in his faithfulness.

Eucharistic Prayer

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them to the Lord.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **People:** It is right to give our thanks and praise.

The Presiding Celebrant acclaims the life-giving power of God in the story of salvation and calls on us to join all creation in the song of the angels. We then sing verses 1-3 of the Sanctus following:



The Presiding Celebrant recounts God's continuing love in the history of humanity and in the sending of his son, Jesus Christ.

We join Jesus as he celebrates his Last Supper and acclaim his giving of himself in the gifts of bread and wine. After the words over the cup and the elevation of the chalice we sing the following:

People: (verse 4) Glory, glory, glory! Glory be to you, O Lord! Glory, glory, glory! Hosanna in the highest!

The Presiding Celebrant calls on the Holy Spirit to bless the gifts and strengthen us until we come to share the joys of eternity. We praise God's endless love and at the elevation of the bread and cup we sing the following:

People: (verse 5) Glory, glory, glory! Glory be to you, O Lord!

Glory, glory, glory! Amen, Amen!


The Breaking of the Bread #1

The Communion PLEASE BE SEATED


All who seek God in Christ are welcome to receive the sacrament of holy communion. If you would prefer a blessing, simply fold your arms across your chest to indicate this.
