Las Posadas Please be seated

"Las Posadas" is a Central American and Mexican Advent tradition in which Mary and Joseph walk through town searching for shelter. They are accompanied on their journey by local church members singing and carrying bright lanterns. Turned away again and again, they finally find householders who welcome them in.

During the season of Advent, we will join with Mary and Joseph in their search for shelter and remember that the search for shelter is a reality for many in our world and our community.

(Congregation knocks/stomps feet three times on Mary & Joseph's cue.)

Innkeeper: What's this awful racket at this hour of the night? Who are you, stranger?

Joseph: I am Joseph, a carpenter. We are cold and tired. We've walked long and far. We have nowhere

to go. Will you let us in for the night?

Innkeeper: No! You look like one of those guys who wander around here looking for work. Your accent is

wrong, and I don't believe your story.

Innkeeper/Choir: Go away!

(Congregation knocks again three times on Mary & Joseph's cue.)

Innkeeper: Another one? Who are you and what do you want?

Mary: I'm Mary. I am pregnant and at the end of my strength. We don't have a lot, but we can pay

you a little. We're honest workers from up Nazareth way and we mean no harm. Surely you

have room in that big house. Please let us in.

Innkeeper: No! You're probably trying to rip us off. We don't need your type around here.

Innkeeper/Choir: Go away!

(Congregation knocks again.)

People: Let us in! You have money and we have none. You have a warm house and we're out in the

cold street. Let us in, please!

Innkeeper: Oh, we've heard all this before and we don't believe it. Get lost or I'll call the soldiers over here.

Innkeeper/Choir: Go away!

But the Emperor has said that all must be counted.


Choir: For your reasons, we care not. Every room is taken.

Second Reading: Philippians 1:3-11


A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Church in Philippi.

The Holy Gospel: Luke 3:1-6

The Presiding Celebrant recounts God's continuing love in the history of humanity and in the sending of his son, Jesus Christ. We join Jesus as he celebrates his Last Supper and acclaim his giving of himself in the gifts of bread and wine. After the words over the cup and the elevation of the chalice, we sing the following:

The Presiding Celebrant calls on the Holy Spirit to bless the gifts and strengthen us until we come to share the joys of eternity. We praise God's endless love and at the elevation of the bread and cup we sing the following:


People: (verse 4) Glory to you, O Lord; glory for evermore! Amen, amen.
