



First Reading: Jeremiah 32:1-3a, 6-15


A Reading from the Book of Jeremiah.

Read by John Knowles

The word that came to Jeremiah from the Lord in the tenth year of King Zedekiah of Judah, which was the eighteenth year of Nebuchadrezzar. At that time the army of the king of Babylon was besieging Jerusalem, and the prophet Jeremiah was confined in the court of the guard that was in the palace of the king of Judah, where King Zedekiah of Judah had confined him. Jeremiah said, The word of the Lord came to me: Hanamel son of your uncle Shallum is going to come to you and say, "Buy my field that is at Anathoth, for the right of redemption by purchase is yours." Then my cousin Hanamel came to me in the court of the guard, in accordance with the word of the Lord, and said to me, "Buy my field that is at Anathoth in the land of Benjamin, for the right of possession and redemption is yours; buy it for yourself." Then I knew that this was the word of the Lord. And I bought the field at Anathoth from my cousin Hanamel, and weighed out the money to him, seventeen shekels of silver. I signed the deed, sealed it, got witnesses, and weighed the money on scales. Then I took the sealed deed of purchase, containing the terms and conditions, and the open copy; and I gave the deed of purchase to Baruch son of Neriah son of Mahseiah, in the presence of my cousin Hanamel, in the presence of the witnesses who signed the deed of purchase, and in the presence of all the Judeans who were sitting in the court of the guard. In their presence I charged Baruch, saying, Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel: Take these deeds, both this sealed deed of purchase and this open deed, and put them in an earthenware jar, in order that they may last for a long time. For thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel: Houses and fields and vineyards shall again be bought in this land.

Second Reading: 1 Timothy 6:6-19 (FNV)

(From the <u>First Nations Version: An Indigenous Translation of the New Testament</u>)

A Reading from the First Letter of Small Man (Paul) to He Gives Honour (Timothy).

It is true that following the ways of the Great Spirit will lead to great possessions, but only when people are at peace with what they have. For we came into this world with nothing and can take nothing with us when we leave it. So, as long as we have food to eat and a roof over our heads, we should be at peace with what we have. Those who long for more and more possessions stumble into temptation and are trapped by many foolish desires that drag them down and take them to a bad end. For the love of possessions is the root of many evil, thorny branches. Some, who have made possessions their aim in life, have walked away from the good road and have been pierced by thorns that bring them much pain and sorrow. But you, O man who follows the Great Spirit, run away from these things and pursue doing what is right, living in a sacred way, trusting, loving, never giving up, and walking softly and in a humble manner. Fight the good fight of trusting Creator. Get a firm hold on the life of the world to come that never fades away, full of beauty and harmony. The Great Spirit called you to this life when you said yes to him and made it known before many people that you had chosen to walk the good road with Creator Sets Free (Jesus) the Chosen One. As you stand before the Great Spirit who gives life to all things, and before Creator Sets Free (Jesus) the Chosen One, who told the truth in a good way when he stood before Spear of the Great Waters (Pilate), I call on you to follow through with this way of life to which he has called you. Keep walking a path that no one can find fault with until the day comes when our Honoured Chief, Creator Sets Free (Jesus) the Chosen One, will appear. That day will be revealed when the time is right by the Blessed One who alone rules above all others, the Grand Chief Above All Chiefs. He is the only one over whom death has no power. His life shines so bright no one can even come near him, and no human eye has ever been able to fully see him. To him belongs all honour and power to the time beyond the end of all days. Aho! May it be so! Instruct the ones who have many possessions in this present world not to see themselves as better than others. In this way, they will be storing up and preparing themselves for the life of the world to come, the true life of beauty and harmony that never grows old or fades away.

Creator Sets Free (Jesus) said, "There was once a man with many possessions who always dressed in the best clothes, had more than enough to eat, and lived a life of ease. Every day a beggar named Creator Helps Him (Lazarus) was laid at the gate of his lodge. Dogs would come and lick the sores that covered his body as he begged for crumbs from the rich man's table. When the time came for the beggar to cross over to the world of the dead, spirit-messengers carried him into the welcoming arms of his ancestor, Father of Many Nations (Abraham). At the same time the rich man also crossed over to death, and his body was buried. In the Dark Underworld of Death (Hades) he was suffering and in pain. He looked up and saw his ancestor, Father of Many Nations (Abraham), far off in the distance. He could see Creator Helps Him (Lazarus) being comforted in his arms. Father of Many Nations (Abraham) said to him, 'They have the words of Drawn from the Water (Moses) and the words of the prophets. Let your family listen to them.' 'No!' the rich man cried out. 'If someone goes back to them from the world of the dead, they will turn their hearts back to Creator.' Father of Many Nations (Abraham) shook his head and said, 'If your family will not listen to Drawn from the Water (Moses) and the prophets, then they will not listen even to one who comes back to life from the dead."



People: (verse 5) Glory be to you, O Lord! Glory now and evermore! To you for evermore. Amen.


The Breaking of the Bread #1
