THE CHRISTMAS STORY

As "Shepherds in the Field Abiding" is sung, children place the shepherds and the angels around the crèche.

As "We Three Kings of Orient Are" is sung, children place the magi from the East around the crèche.

We three kings of Orient are; bearing gifts, we traverse afar: Field and fountain, moor and mountain, following yonder star. O Star of wonder, star of night, star with royal beauty bright, Westward leading, still proceeding, guide us to thy Perfect Light.

As "Silent Night" is sung, all children (accompanied by parents, if needed) are welcome to come and place stars around the crèche.

Round yon virgin mother and child. Holy infant so tender and mild,
Sleep in heavenly peace.

Silent night! Holy night! Shepherds quake at the sight: Glories stream from heaven afar, heavenly hosts sing alleluia, Christ the Saviour is born.

People: And also with you.


Presider: Lift up your hearts.


People: We lift them to the Lord.

The Presiding Celebrant acclaims the life-giving power of God in the story of salvation and calls on us to join all creation in the song of the angels. We then sing verses 1-2 of the Sanctus as follows:





The Presiding Celebrant recounts God's continuing love in the history of humanity and in the sending of his son, Jesus Christ. We join Jesus as he celebrates his Last Supper and acclaim his giving of himself in the gifts of bread and wine. After the words over the cup and the elevation of the chalice, we sing:

The Presiding Celebrant calls on the Holy Spirit to bless and strengthen us, the Church, until we come to share the joys of heaven. We praise God's endless love, and at the elevation of the bread and cup, we sing:

The Breaking of the Bread


Presider: We break the bread of life, and that life is the light of the world.
